**Water Safety Month**

**WHEREAS**, we understand the essential role that water-safety education plays in preventing drownings and recreational water-related injuries; and

**WHEREAS**, the citizens of our state are aware of the contributions made by the recreational water industry, as represented by the organizations involved in the National Water Safety Month Coalition, in developing safe swimming facilities, aquatic programs, home pools and spas, and in supporting other related activities that provide healthy places for people to recreate, learn and grow, build self-esteem, confidence and sense of self-worth. **WHEREAS**, we understand the vital importance of communicating water-safety rules and programs to families and individuals of all ages, from owners of private pools to users of public swimming facilities and visitors to waterparks;
